## **Dear Parents and Friends**

We will be holding our Whole School Public Speaking Competition this Friday. This event is the culmination of many weeks of learning the skills of public speaking. These skills go beyond just the ability to speak confidently in front of an audience; they also contribute to personal and academic development. Here are some of the key advantages for our students:

- Improved Communication Skills: Public speaking helps students develop strong verbal and non-verbal communication skills. They learn how to articulate their thoughts clearly, use appropriate body language, and modulate their voice for better understanding.



#### **DIOCESAN RESULTS**


Nicolas, Beau and Amelia have progressed through to the Polding Athletics Carnival which will be held at Homebush in Week 1 next term.

#### **FRUIT & VEG MONTH**


Corpus Christi is participating in Fruit & Vegetable month in September!


This is a health promotion event that aims to encourage increased fruit and vegetable consumption amongst NSW primary school children through engaging activities for the classroom, whole of school and at home.
