## FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents and Friends,

It was tremendous seeing so many parents attending our Parent Information evening last night. Teachers may have mentioned our investment as a school in the Essential Assessment platform for 2024. This platform supports learning in Mathematics and English from K-6 and delivers a whole school approach to summative and formative assessment for Australian schools. Each teacher preassesses each student within each strand or sub-strand of the NSW Syllabus. This testing has been undertaken across all our classes.

Student results are then automatically compiled advising the teacher of each student's current progression point or level and a report of the achievement standards that each student has understood and misunderstood. This allows and supports targeted teaching and gap filling for any misconceptions students may have. Work is aligned to the children's level of achievement supporting their misunderstandings and providing work to consolidate their learning.

Essential Assessment will improve the school's ability to differentiate our Mathematics and English content for the individual, group and whole class as it utilises students' results and creates a tailored paper-based and online curriculum.

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My Numeracy and My Literacy is a differentiated and personalised practice assessment model with an interactive teaching and learning function that enables students to progress through each of their current misunderstandings at their own pace. In addition, this function can be used as additional work at home for students wanting further extension and practice.

The post assessment will allow teachers to accurately report on your child's academic level and growth. This will also provide our school with improved data on students' growth and achievement as they progress through each year level.

Highlights of the program:

- Individualised support for each student from K-6

For our children needing support in Mathematics this targeted intervention is ideal and for our students requiring extension in Mathematics the outcomes are covered up to a Year 10 level. We look forward to sharing more detailed information with you over the 2024 school year.

#### PARENT MESSAGES TO THE OFFICE

Could I please ask for your support in helping us to reduce the number of interruptions to classrooms during school hours. Each time a parent contacts the office to pass on a message to their child/children it means that the teacher needs to stop teaching to respond to these messages. As a way of limiting these interruptions, we will now be calling children down to the office at 2:55pm to receive any messages at the end of the day. Where possible please inform your child/children in advance of their pick up procedures. Of course we do understand that last minute changes do occur.

Children should not be leaving school early or during school hours to attend extracurricular activities unless these have been approved by the school. While parents are legally responsible for the regular attendance of their children, school staff members monitor student attendance daily, including part or whole day absences, as a consequence of both their duty of care and legislative requirements. Please do not pick your children up early for convenience reasons as this works against the schools attendance requirements and interrupts the learning of other students.

#### **WET WEATHER**

Could I please request that all children have a raincoat in their bags for wet weather. Umbrella's are not allowed at school as they can be very dangerous around other children. You can buy raincoats from Kmart, Lowes, Target and Cowan & Lewis.

## NAPLAN NEWS

#### NAPLAN 2024 - Years 3 and 5



NAPLAN (National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy) time is drawing near again for Years 3 and 5 students with testing set this year for Term 1 Week 6, Wed 13th – Fri 15th March.

The results of these assessments aim to provide diagnostic information for parents and teachers about each student's performance in literacy and numeracy. The assessments are earlier this year so that results and important data about student learning may be accessed as early as possible.

At Corpus Christi we use the NAPLAN data to help teachers identify students who require greater challenges or additional support and to identify strengths and weaknesses in teaching programs and set goals in literacy and numeracy.

Throughout the year, our students undertake a wide range of assessments which enable us to build a strong profile of their learning needs and strengths. NAPLAN is designed to provide one of the measures of a child's progress. It is completed in Term 1 (as above) and results are provided later in the year.

All NAPLAN assessment this year will be presented in the ONLINE format except for Year 3 Writing, which is in pen and paper format.

School iPads will be provided to all students to complete the assessment, even if they usually bring their own devices. All devices have been checked and aligned to minimum standards for successful participation in the assessments.

All students are required to bring their own headphones each day of the assessment period.

Students who are absent for any of the assessments will be provided with make up sessions as soon as possible after their absence. **The assessment window closes on Monday, 26th March.** All assessments must be completed by this date and any student unable to complete assessments by 26th March will be marked as absent.

Students have voice and choice, they get to ask questions, they are creating, and they own the learning process. We would love to share what we learn with our parents, grandparents and other students.


