
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FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Our Learner Diversity Team supports children both inside and outside the classroom to implement adjustment, strategies and Individual Learning Plans so that all children can access the curriculum. This team is timetabled into all classrooms across the school week.





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Our High Potential and Gifted Team works with students across all grades to set goals alongside classroom teachers and to update Individual Learning Plans. The team works with mentors in our community and beyond.





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SPARK Academy

I would just like to take a moment now to tell you of a very exciting project we are piloting with four other north shore schools this year. SPARK is a project set to cater for high ability and or gifted students within a domain that they have a proven record of achievement in. The project is called SPARK – Supporting Potential Among Remarkable Kids. We aim to bring together like minded students from different schools. Throughout 2024 we currently have 9 days planned as listed below:

Day 1 - Corpus Christi

Join us for a day immersed in art! Explore the elements and principles of art while creating two unique artworks. Dive into the underwater world with watercolor and acrylic paints, experimenting with textures and colours. - ·Find a hill and run up and down it a few times.

- ·Set goals and run to them- run to tree, now run to post, next run to gate around the area.
- ·Listen to up-tempo music and just jog along.
- ·Run- walk session (1 minute run, 30 seconds walk, 2 mins run, 1 min walk
- ·Run a few more extra laps after your netball, rugby, AFL, soccer training sessions.




NATIONAL RIDE2SCHOOL DAY 2024

Main message

Join more than 350,000 students from almost 900 schools around Australia who will be registered to participate in this year's National Ride2School Day

Key messages

Why Ride2School?

- Bike riding is the easiest way to get healthy: It is recommended that children
 get 60 minutes of physical activity every day to maintain their health, and
 riding a bike to school is an easy and fun way to make sure they are hitting this
 target. It's also a great way for parents to spend quality time with their
 children.
- It improves physical activity rates: In the 1970's, 80% of all school children rode
 or walked to school but now more than two-thirds go by car. Thanks to
 Ride2School that trend is reversing schools that participate in the
 Ride2School Program report an average active travel rate of 54%.
- It helps build confidence: Riding, walking, skating or scooting to school will
 make your students feel more self-sufficient, build resilience and helps them to
 develop an awareness of road safety and the environment around them.
- Students perform better in class: Being active on the school journey has a
 much greater impact on student concentration than having breakfast before
 school. A Danish study has shown that children who walk or ride to school
 display improved concentration for 4 hours longer than those who are driven.

National Ride2School Day is the perfect opportunity for students and school communities across Australia to embrace a healthier start and to try riding and walking to school for themselves.

Check out some of our ideas on how to plan the best National Ride2School Day ever!

Obstacle course

Set up a bike obstacle course on your basketball court or oval so students can get full use of their wheels before school starts.



Bike educatio

Integrate bike education and bike skills into the day (or even better - into the curriculum)!

Guest speakers

Arrange an assembly with a special guest speaker (e.g. Member of Parliament, local police officers or local riding super-stars) to inspire students to actively travel to school more often.

Healthy breakfast

Host a healthy breakfast with some tasty fruit and breakfast snacks.



Fundraising

Take the opportunity to raise funds by encouraging students to dress up (or dress up their bikes) and ask for a gold coin donation on the day. The proceeds can go towards improving the bike parking facilities at your school.



Dike parade

Host a 'decorate your blke' or 'decorate your helmet' competition and have students parade their creations at assembly.

Poster activity

Organise a craft session and have students design their own posters to put up around the school and advertise the day.



Active travel raffle

Hand out raffle tickets to the walkers and wheelers as they arrive at school and present a prize at the assembly.

HandsUp! count

Collect a HandsUp! count by asking your students how they travelled to school. You can use this to work out how much CO2 your school has saved by actively travelling.
