



Registration Process:

Corpus Christi Hawks Soccer Club follows the FFA process. All NEW and returning players please go to <http://www.myfootballclub.com.au/>

Choose the correct online registration option that applies to you. You will likely be offered a few package options depending on the birth year of your child so please use the following as a guideline if you would like your child to play with his classmates:

Kindergarten – U6

Year 1 – U7

Year 2 – U8

Year 3 – U9

Year 4 – U10

Year 5 – U11

Year 6 – U12

“Playing up” and “Playing down” is allowed on an exceptional basis providing we follow the NSFA process and request for their permission on a case-by-case basis. So please contact us on cchawks10@gmail.com so we discuss it and take it up with the NSFA.

Returning players will need to find their FFA number (assigned to you when you registered for the first time) to complete their registration. If you can't find it, there is a very easy way to retrieve it on the website. Password reset is easily available as well.

New players will first need to create an FFA-account to be able to complete their registration.

Ensure all player and contact details are correct and/ or up to date.

Select Club Name – Corpus Christi (Club) and continue with online payment. Payment can be done online by credit card during the registration process or you can also opt for payment via direct debit to the club's bank account before March 10th:

Junior Jersey/ Shorts are provided by the Club. These will be distributed by your team manager before the beginning of the season and are to be returned at the end of the season.

Registration will be approved upon receipt of registration fee payment.

Payment plans are available upon request and other options can be discussed as well. Please send an email to cchawks10@gmail.com and we will be in touch with you.

Once a payment plan has been agreed upon, they must be respected and payments should be made on time and should not require a reminder.

Volunteer Coaches of Junior Teams will get a full rebate of fees for the child playing in their team, to be rebated at the end of the season and providing coaching has been provided for the full season.

Registration Period

Registration will close on March 10th as teams need to be communicated to the NSFA by March 11th.

Late registration will not be penalised by a Late Fee, however the Club will only accept registrations after closing date provided teams have vacancies. This means you may not end up with your preferred age/ grading team and "playing up" may be used to balance teams out.

The NSFA has advised that teams can only be added during the season providing there is a BYE in a division.

Refunds

Full refunds are available until the start of the season, which is April 1st. Once the season has started, a reduced refund will apply being the registration fee paid minus fees due to the NSFA. Refunds will be processed upon return of jersey/ shorts to the team manager for Junior Teams.

Code of Conduct – Junior Players, Parents, Coaches & Managers

Players

- Play by the rules.
- Do not argue with a referee. If you disagree with a referee's decision, please talk to your coach or manager and let them deal with this on your behalf.
- Respect your teammates, the other team's players, the referee and also your coach and manager.
- Shake hands with the other team's players as well as the referee at the end of the game.
- No verbal nor physical abuse.
- Play to the best of your abilities and be a team player.

Parents

- Be a role model and encourage good behaviour on the field.
- Keep in mind children play soccer for their own enjoyment, not yours.
- Encourage children to participate but do not force them.
- Never ridicule or yell at a child for making a mistake or losing a competition.
- Focus on the children's efforts and performance rather than winning or losing.
- Respect officials/ decisions and teach children to do likewise.
- Show appreciation for volunteer coaches, managers and officials. Without them, your child could not participate.

Coaches

- Remember that winning is only part of the fun, kids participate because they enjoy the game and being out on the field with their friends.
- Never ridicule or yell at a child for making a mistake or losing a competition.
- Focus on the children's efforts and performance rather than winning or losing.
- Be reasonable in your expectations.
- All players are deserving of equal attention and opportunities.
- Avoid overplaying the talented players, the just average need and deserve equal time.
- Be respectful of all and at all times professional. Lead by example.
- Show concern and caution toward sick and injured players.
